Further update on Vacancy

I am picking up the story where I left off in the September/October newsletter. As you know, all four churches in the Pastorate approved the Pastorate Profile so we were able to finalise it and send it off to the Synod Pastoral Committee (North Eastern) in good time for its meeting on 12 September. At that meeting, the Committee accepted the Profile and declared the vacancy.

The vacancy had already been accepted by the Mission and Learning Committee so we were able to move forward to the next step. The Profile was tabled at the October Moderators' meeting and we were told that introductions to a Minister may come from the November Moderators' meeting.

The Moderators are planning to circulate the Pastorate Profile in October but before they do so, they wanted to know whether the churches in our new Pastorate would be willing to consider an application from a candidate in a same-sex marriage or same sex relationship.

It was made clear to us that churches were allowed to say that they are not prepared to consider a candidate in a same-sex marriage or same sex relationship, but if that was the case then the Moderators needed to know before they advertised the post. We were told that whatever we decided was absolutely fine; Moderators just needed to know what each church's decision was. I know that Marlow, Maidenhead and Windsor have all considered the issue and fed back to our Interim Moderator, Rev Michael Hodgson. I suspect that Bracknell have done so too.

This should mean that the Profile will be circulated to Ministers in October as planned and that we may indeed receive introductions as early as mid-November.

The next meeting of the Pastorate Vacancy Committee which is made up of three representatives from each of the four churches and the two Interim Moderators will be on 6 November. At that meeting the Committee will focus on the process for taking a decision on whether to invite any potential candidate to

visit the Pastorate, arrangements for any such visit, the process for taking a decision on whether to invite that person to preach with a view and arrangements for preaching with a view including the voting procedures. It could be a long meeting!!

The only other point I should mention is that Synod has accepted that the manse in Maidenhead is not fit for purpose. There are two other manses in the pastorate – one in Bracknell and the other in Old Windsor. Synod has agreed that the new Minister should be involved in the decision as to which of those will be used as the Pastorate manse.

As always, we will keep you posted as things move forward. Valerie Brownridge



(Of course we had cake to follow!)


The previous day Stephen was presented with his certificate for 60 years in the ministry at the Wessex Synod meeting. More celebration!


Great Papa's 114th birthday and the day myself and Ronnie got engaged.

Christian Aid Update

On 15 October I took part in a Zoom meeting, convened by Phil Evans, our regional Christian Aid coordinator, to hear an update on Christian Aid activities. We heard about the situation in South Sudan, Christian Aid's Christmas appeal,

and an update on the situation in Gaza.



South Sudan

South Sudan is the focus of this year's Christmas appeal. It is the world's newest nation, and when it was established in 2011 as a result of a

referendum, resources poured in on a wave of optimism and hope. However civil war broke out in 2013, undoing a lot of progress, and we heard from Annabelle Grassini, who has worked in South Sudan with VSO, about the challenges the population now face. Two-fifths of the population are under 15, life expectancy

is low, and of the population of 12 million, 9 million need assistance. Travel is difficult because there are almost no surfaced roads. Healthcare is very short of resources and education is limited. A girl is more likely to die in childbirth than finish secondary school.

There are a lot of refugees and displaced people, who do find some support in communities – despite having very little, people share what they have.

Christmas Appeal

This Christmas Christian Aid is supporting people like Shede, a refugee in Wedweil Refugee Settlement in South Sudan. Christian Aid's partner **Smile Again Africa Development Organisation (SAADO)** works in 4 areas: Humanitarian assistance,
Building Peace, Preventing Violence against Women and Climate Resilience.


Scout Group News


The Cubs and Scouts managed camps/sleepovers
